TRUMP DRUMS UP SUPPORT DURING TOUR OF PA.

Candidate appears at rally, McDonald's and Steelers game

LANCASTER, Pa. — Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump campaigned across Pennsylvania on Sunday — from behind the counter of a McDonald's near Philadelphia and a Lancaster town hall to Acrisure Stadium for the Pittsburgh Steelers game — as he sought to bolster support among the critical battleground state's rural and working class voters two weeks before Election Day.

"To me, they're big people," he told broadcaster and podcaster

Musk gives away \$1M at McKees Rocks rally

Elon Musk rallied Allegheny County residents to vote for Donald Trump and answered dozens of wide-ranging questions about his political beliefs during a town hall event in McKees Rocks on Sunday.

The event, organized by Mr. Musk's recently established America PAC, took place in the Roxian Theatre. It was the latest stop of Mr. Musk's statewide tour to stump for Trump, the Republican presidential candidate, ahead of the 2024 election.

Rural town is left without a doctor

Closure of physician's office causes concern

EMLENTON, Pa. — A Pittsburgh-based health system shuttered a physician's office in this speck of an Allegheny River town in southeast Venango County, leaving the borough without a doctor for the first time in decades and elderly residents trying to figure out how to get to medical appointments.

UPMC's recent closure of the Emlenton Area Family Practice on Main Street left the borough's 650 residents without a doctor, which is being felt most acutely by elderly and disabled residents of a subsidized housing complex across the street. Clinic patient Betty Bishop, who lives in the complex, said she now has to figure out how to get a ride to her UPMC doctor's office in Shippenville, Clarion County, about 20 miles away.

Mobile clinic makes dental care accessible to homeless

For Elizabeth Price, living with the ache of a decaying tooth was just part of life.

Although the 31-year-old had insurance through AmeriHealth Caritas, securing an appointment takes months and the coverage is

limited to exams. An X-ray showed the tooth was in bad shape, but she couldn't afford to do anything about it.

And fixing it wasn't a priority, anyway. She has been experiencing homelessness on and off since 2015. This summer, she had to temporarily live in a hotel after being displaced by the Second Avenue

Commons fire. When she lost her job, she couldn't afford the room anymore and ended up at Pittsburgh Mercy's temporary Reedsdale Street facility on the North Side.

This past week, Ms. Price finally got relief at no cost, getting the extraction she has long needed on a 38-foot RV known as "Heals

on Wheels," or HOWie.

"I'm really glad they're here to help people," Ms. Price said, tending to the gauze in her mouth after her appointment. "My tooth was so damaged."

Once a month, the nonprofit Metro Community Health brings
